1996 Professional Car Society International Meet Agenda

Wednesday August 14: The registration desk will be open for the "early bird" arrivals. After noon, we will form a motorcade and proceed to the General Fire Apparatus plant in Wyoming, MN, which is about 30 miles North of the Twin Cities on I-35. We will tour the General plant and have the opportunity to inspect brand new fire apparatus in various stages of completion. The fire buffs will be able to load up with literature and photograph the antique pumper truck which is on display in General's showroom.

We'll head back to the Twin Cities for some fire station and funeral home touring. The evening hours will be for relaxing at the hotel, socializing, viewing photos and slides, etc.

Thursday August 15: We'll form a professional car motorcade, complete with police escorts, and proceed to the Ford truck assembly plant in St. Paul. The Ford plant tour is scheduled to begin at 10:00 A.M. and will last about an hour. We will then motorcade a short distance to Road Rescue, Inc. to tour the plant where new ambulances and rescue trucks are manufactured. After the tour, everyone may go on their own for lunch and an afternoon of shopping, sightseeing, or relaxing at the hotel. There will be maps available for those who do not know their way around the Twin Cities, as well as us local "tour guides." Shuttle vans will be available to take anyone not interested in participating in the Ford and Road Rescue tours to the Mall of America. (NOTE: Time at the Mall of America is also included in Friday's agenda.)

Thursday eveing we will go to Boom Island in Minneapolis to board the Anson Northrup sternwheeler. We will be treated to a fabulous three-hour riverboat cruise on the Mississippi River past Minneapolis' waterfront and through the upper locks for a view of St. Anthony Falls and the James J. Hill "Old Stone Arch Bridge."

Friday August 16: A deluxe motorcoach will depart from the Holiday Inn at 8:00 A.M. and take us on a three hour guided tour highlighting Minneapolis and St. Paul's major points of interest and beautiful sights including the Minnesota State Capitol, St. Paul's Cathedral, Minneapolis' famed chain of lakes, downtown areas, the University of Minnesota, and much more. After the cities tour, the bus will stop at the Mall of America, where everyone will have the opportunity to eat lunch and spend the afternoon shopping and having fun at Knott's Camp Snoopy, the large, indoor amusement park. For those who wish to go on the cities tour but not spend the afternoon at the Mall of America, the bus will return to the Holiday Inn immediately after dropping folks off at the mall. There will also be shuttle service available throughout the afternoon between the Mall of America and the Holiday Inn.

The bus will return all "mall goers" to the hotel by 4:30 P.M. Everyone will have time to freshen up before the professional car motorcade to Johnson-Williams Funeral Car Service/Carey Limousine in Minneapolis. Owner Larry Dunn will give a presentation and tour of his impressive operation. A barbecue supper will be served, followed by the PCS annual business meeting. In past years, it has been possible to actually have some professional cars in the midst of the PCS annual banquet. This year, we will be able to have the annual business meeting in such an atmosphere.

Saturday August 17: Show day! Members who have brought professional cars to the meet will have an opportunity to shine them up for the Concours d'Elegance show. This year, cars will be judged under the direction of PCS Chief Judge George L. Hamlin. In order to let the serious professional car photographers in attendance have their fun, we are planning a mid-afternoon motorcade a short distance to a cemetery for a photo shoot. This particular cemetery has many photogenic locations within, suitable for funeral, livery, and rescue vehicles.

Saturday evening we will have a cocktail hour in a reserved banquet room at the Holiday Inn, which will be followed by the PCS Grand Awards Banquet. Guest speaker will be Roger D. White, M.D. of the Mayo Clinic in Rochester, MN. Dr. White is a long-time professional car enthusiast and collector who made many efforts to keep passenger-car based ambulances in production. He is the proud owner of the very last Cadillac ambulance manufactured, a 1979 Superior Cadillac.

After the awards have been doled out and the result of the silent auction in which a nice 1975 C/B Oldsmobile combination will be sold to some lucky PCS member is known, we will adjourn out to the parking lot for the traditional light and sound show.

<u>Sunday August 18:</u> Farewell. Have a safe trip home. The 1997 International Meet will be in Maryland hosted by the Mid-Atlantic Chapter.


