COVER PHOTO – If all goes according to plan, this stunning -- and rare -- 1957 S&S Cadillac Professional Highbody Ambulance will be at the 2008 PCS International Meet in Mount Laurel, N.J. in August. Donated to the Cranbury NJ First Aid Squad when the squad was organized that same year, it was later donated to the Plainsboro NJ First Aid Squad when the Plainsboro Squad was formed in 1974. When Plainsboro could afford to buy their own new vehicles, they returned the '57 S&S to Cranbury – which kept it as a parade piece. This is believed to be the only surviving example of several 1957 S&S ambulances used in the Garden State.
