COVER PHOTO - As you may surmise from both covers, the bulk of this issue is dedicated to coverage, in words and photos, of The Professional Car Society's 2008 International Meet hosted by the Society's Northeast Chapter in Mount Laurel, New Jersey in early August. Among the more than sixty vintage hearses, ambulances, combinations, livery-type limousines and flower and service cars at the meet were two Studebaker Ambulets - Jeff Beyer's `55, which has participated in many previous PCS meets, and Mount Airy, Maryland member Steve Lichtman's recently restored 1954. Steve's baby-blue Ambulet, a factory-built conversion of Studebaker's Commander Conestoga station wagon - originally saw service in Nashwauk, Minnesota. Steve found this beauty on Ebay two years ago and with the help of Northland Chapter member Tony Karsnia hauled it home from Minnesota on a trailer. Steve finished the total restoration of this car only days before the big New Jersey meet. PCS publicity chair and official meet photographer Gregg Merksamer photographed Steve's ambulance in front of the appropriately named Silver Diner in Cherry Hill, the next town over from Mount Laurel, where we enjoyed shakes and burgers the first night of the meet. This classic diner is patterned after one opened in 1939 with such art deco flourishes as "stacked cube" tile floors, octagonpatterned stools and a chrome-plated cash register. There are 16 Silver Diners in Maryland and Virginia. With all that stainless steel and neon, we thought the diner made a perfect setting for Steve's 1950s South Bend-built classic.

<u>CENTER STRETCH</u> – This year's meet report is somewhat unusual in that nearly *all* of the photographs in it were taken by just *one* photographer. As anyone who has ever attended a PCS meet knows, *Gregg Merksamer* seems to pop up everywhere we go. Gregg also wrote nearly all of this year's meet report. Mr. Merksamer took our center stretch and back cover photos from the VIP suite on the top floor of the Windham Hotel as the meet was in full swing Saturday morning.
