COUNTDOWN TO LAHASKA

Early registration a must for May 19th meet, Marcy declares

Final preparations for the Northeast Chapter's first spring charity car show, to be held at Peddler's Village in Lahaska, Bucks County, PA on Sunday, May 19th, were the center-of-discussion at the winter meeting hosted by Jeff & Mary Hookway in Sparta, NJ on March 10th. With the event just four weeks away, Chapter President Bill Marcy re-emphasized that pre-registration forms should be sent to him ASAP (an extra copy is enclosed on pages 5-6) to ensure that the event runs smoothly, even if the official submission deadline is May 10th.

Calling it "a great opportunity to showcase our Chapter," Bill declared that "I would like to see a hundred cars there, with a procar turnout like we had at Lahaska last September (more than twenty vehicles out of 83, thanks to Chapter member Andy Toton's efforts on behalf of the Cadillac-LaSalle Club's Valley Forge Region). This is a terrific location in a beautiful setting just a couple of miles inside Pennsylvania, with plenty of spectators, shops and restaurants. The people in charge of the place couldn't be nicer to us - they were all 'it's free, you're welcome' and Bingo, we're off-and-running. Pass out copies of the flyer wherever you can, and be sure to tell your friends in other car clubs that the field will be open to ALL years and makes of cars and trucks - a PT Cruiser is as much fun to look at as anything else. And it's all for a good cause, with the proceeds benefitting the Port Authority PBA World Trade Center Survivors Fund." Vice-President & Activities Director Craig Stewart elaborated that "the money will go directly to the families of the 37 Port Authority police officers who were killed at the Twin Towers on September 11th. One of their representatives will be at the show, so there's no middlemen or administration costs eating into what we raise."

Sunday, May 19th will be a very important date on our 2002 calendar, as the PCS Northeast Chapter will be holding its first charity show at Peddler's Village in Lahaska, PA. In addition to scratchbuilt local landmarks like the Lackawanna RR station, each of which took from one to five months to finish, this scale scene incorporates several fires, auto accidents and funeral corteges (including one for a drunk driver) incorporating scale professional cars, as well as a depiction of President Clinton's visit (complete with limousines and Secret Service vehicles) to the ship-shaped Cooper's Seafood restaurant following his father-in-law's funeral. 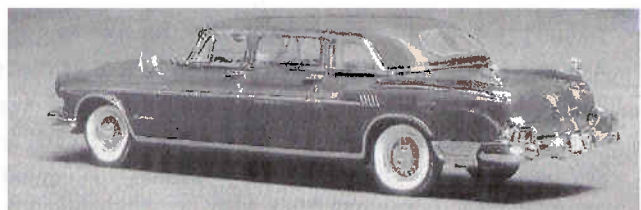

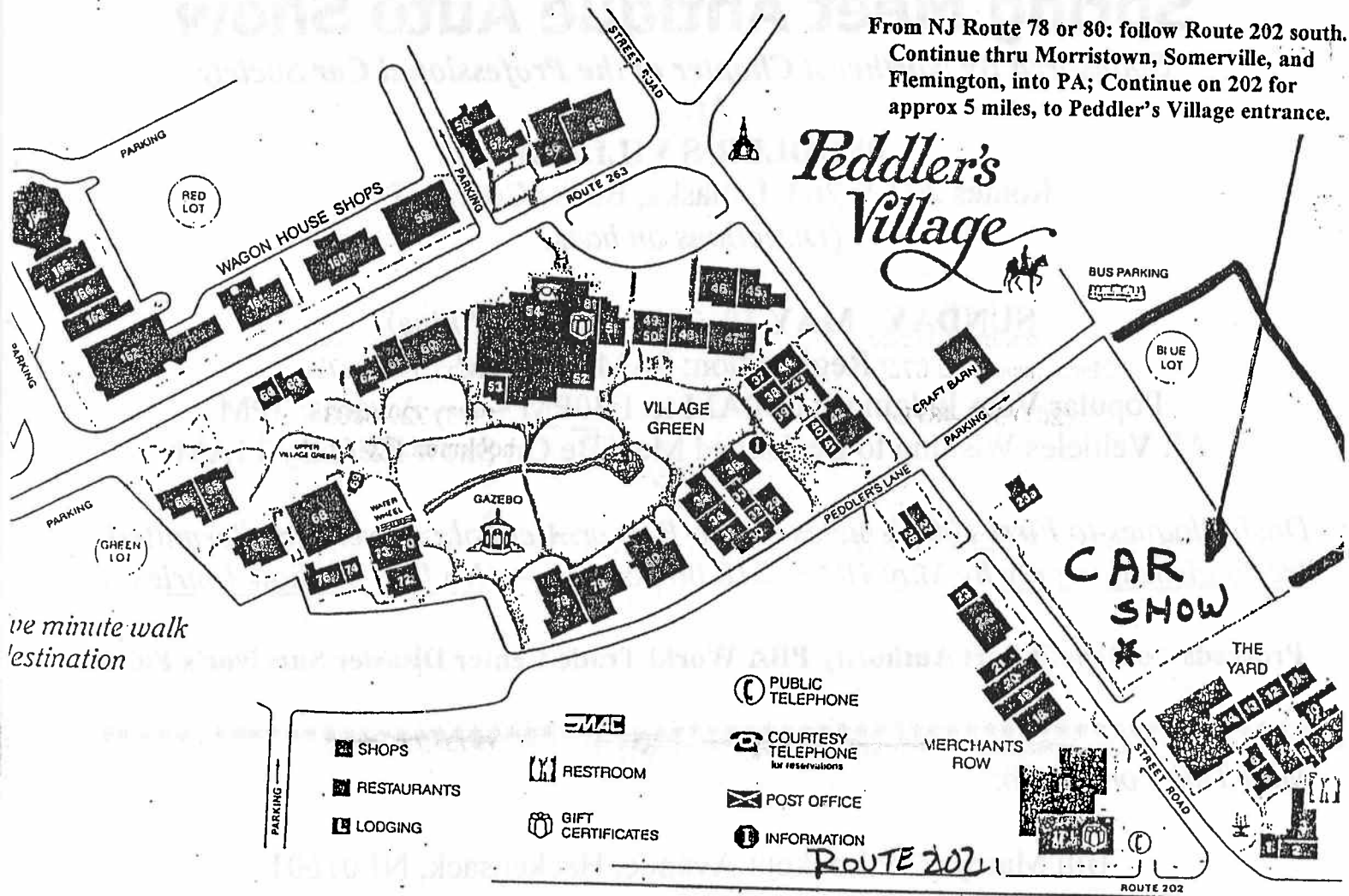
