

# INTRODUCING THE NEW JOHN KEEL AWARD WINNER



At the international meet this summer, the PCS was proud to award Ohio member Bill Peoples the John Keel Award for Youthful Enthusiasm. Since 2003, this award has been given in memory of John Keel, who was one of the PCS' youngest and most enthusiastic members. John died in 2002. The award honors John's memory and recognizes PCS members who are young (or young at heart) and who have an excitement for the professional car hobby and for the organization. Bill is the third Ohio Chapter member to earn this coveted award. His continued dedication to the professional car hobby shows when he displays his cars at funeral director conventions, has them in star studded movies and when he shares his collection at his funeral museum in Marietta He shows his dedication to the Professional Car Society by being an active member for over three decades, graciously hosting chapter meets and most recently by trailering his collection 1,278 miles, so he could share all of his professional cars at the meet in Hudson

and help ensure that the Ohio meet broke records for number of cars in attendance.

We talked with Bill to learn more about life in Marietta, his gorgeous cars and what keeps the PCS fun for him after 30 years of membership.

Which of your professional cars is your favorite and why?

All of my cars are special - here are my favorite aspects of each one: 1895 Sayers & Scovill horsedrawn hearse -

ornate carvings on an excellent coach 1927 Henney combination - photographs well in movies

1938 A J Miller Packard hearse - one of a kind and I love the open town car

1940 Henney Packard combination - it's a work horse, reliable, long, and fun to drive at funerals

1947 Packard limo - great car to drive around town. Fun to use for weddings because it gets lots of attention.

1948 Packard sedan - same as the '47. I love the vinyl top. It really sets this car apart.

1949 Packard parts car - may be my favorite, as it costs me nothing!

1960 Rambler Ambassador - my wife bought it - she won't let me touch it!

How did you get involved in the professional car hobby?

We decided to get involved due to our business. As funeral directors, we wanted a hobby to enjoy, as well as having a desire to promote our business. At the time, a horse drawn hearse seemed impractical - without horses. And we decided we liked the pre-war coaches more than the later ones. So, if you're going after a pre-war funeral vehicle, why not a Packard? "Ask the man who owns one." My first PCS event was when Pat (my wife) and I drove our 1940 Henney Packard combination from Marietta to Indianapolis in, I believe, 1982. Following that, she went in for a three year restoration...the Henney Packard, not Pat!

Bill, you have spent decades in the PCS. What makes the club a special organization to you?

As you know, I love the old cars, and stay involved because outside of the PCS, it's hard to find folks who share the same interest. Ordinary car shows are nice, but it's our group that appreciates the true craft of coach building.

What does earning the John Keel Award mean to you?

Being honored with the John Keel Award was marvelous. I don't consider myself youthful much, but I am enthusiastic about the PCS. Working in Marietta, I wasn't available to help my friends out in the Ohio Chapter when they were trying to put together the 2011 International Meet. Therefore, I decided I would at least try to bring some of my vehicles to add to the number of cars on display. Yes, it was a lot of miles, and some expense to rent garages, but it was all worth it. I had a great week.

Other than getting recognition for your collection of procars, what else keeps you coming back to PCS meets?

PCS meets are great to meet up with others who enjoy this hobby. I always come away with a few new ideas, and a few new contacts. To sit around and have a drink or two, with no deadlines or commitments to meet, I find very relaxing. And who knows, there may even be a ball thrown through your hotel window to liven things up a bit!

So what else keeps you busy in Marietta?

When I'm not working at the funeral home or showing my cars and antique funeral items in our museum, I enjoy time spent on our boat cruising the rivers in our area.






### NEEDFUL THINGS FOR PROCAR PEOPLE CONT.
